Rejoice in God's goodness

There was a story about two neighbours who were great rivals. When one got a new car the other would try to get a better one and vice versa. They both tried to outdo each other. One day a devil appeared to one of them and offered, "You can ask for anything you like and you will get it. However, your neighbour will get twice as much of **whatever** you ask for?" "You mean if I ask for a brand new car I would get it?" He asked. "Yes, you would get it, but your neighbour will get 2 brand new cars," answered the devil. "You mean he will get more than me" the man exclaimed. After a long pause, he said, "Alright, in that case I will settle for one blind eye!"

We all experience jealousy and rivalry in our life. They can happen everywhere wherever there are people. For instance: at work place, in our neighbourhood and even in our family. They prevent us from seeing the goodness in others and rejoice with them, moreover to appreciate the beauty around us.

Earlier in the chapter. St Mark has told us of a man who appealed to Jesus' disciples to free his son from a spirit of dumbness. This anxious father told Jesus: "I asked your disciples to cast it out but they were unable to." The disciples have been seen as unsuccessful exorcists. Therefore, in today's Gospel, they were jealous of the man who succeeded where they failed. Thus, John complains to Jesus about someone outside their circle who exorcises demons invoking Jesus' name. But Jesus rebukes him saying, "Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me. For whoever is not against us is for us." Jesus allows his name to be used to cure the afflicted, expel demons and to do good i.e. he wants us to use this healing power to bring about goodness and love. He refuses to box in goodness but invites his fragile insecure disciples to a wider vision in order to recognize God's goodness no matter where it is to be found. Pope John Paul II in his Tertio Millennio Adveniente writes, 'the Church, the community of believers, rejoices in Jesus' salvation. But in the spirit of Jesus' graciousness for all, the Church invites everyone, even those who do not profess faith in Jesus, to rejoice, and she tries to create conditions to ensure that the power of salvation may be shared by all.'

Let us pray that we will be more inclusive despite the differences and become more understanding people who can rejoice in the good done by others and to others.



Saints of the Week



St Therese of the Child Jesus

Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, born Marie Françoise-Thérèse Martin, also known as Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face, O.C.D., was a French Catholic Discalced Carmelite nun who devoted her life to loving God . As a permanent novice, she would never be able to perform

great deeds. She did however scatter flowers, each flower a little sacrifice and a little action for God and love. After not feeling well for sometime, she became gravely ill. She remained silent and cheerful until the end and passed away at the age of 24. She is widely venerated in modern times. She is popularly known as "The Little Flower of Jesus" or simply "The Little Flower".

The Holy Guardian Angels

The Memorial of the Holy Guardian Angels is a memorial of the Catholic Church officially observed on 2 October. Catholics set up altars in honour of guardian angels as early as the 4th Century, and local celebrations of a feast in honour of guardian angels go back to the 11th Century.

St Francis of Assisi

Saint Francis of Assisi, born Giovanni di Pietro di Bernardone, informally named as Francesco, was a wealthy young man of privilege, served as a soldier and was a prisoner of war. He heard God's call and became a Catholic friar, deacon and preacher. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of

Saint Clare, the Third Order of Saint Francis and the Custody of the Holy Land. He went on to be one of the most venerated Catholic Saints. He designed the first Nativity set and was the first man ever recorded to receive the Stigmata, the wounds of Christ

Patron: Animals, Merchants and Ecologists



St Brund

Bruno was born in Cologne of the prominent Hartenfaust family. He studied at the Cathedral school at Rheims. He was ordained in 1055 and became a professor of theology. He was one of the most remarkable scholars and teachers of his time. He and six companions built a

monastery and founded the Cathusians order in 1084. They embraced poverty, manual labour, prayer and transcribing manuscripts. Their fame spread and Bruno became an advisor to the Pope. After 6 years he founded St Mary's monastery in Calbria. He passed away in 1102.
