### PALM SUNDAY

Palm Sunday begins our Holy Week which means accompanying Christ on his final journey, bearing our own crosses in trusting silence. It reminds us of the excitement as the Jewish people triumphantly welcome Jesus into Jerusalem:

"Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

They wanted to make Jesus their King who will free them from the Roman's oppression, and domination, perhaps they hoped that Jesus' miraculous powers will eliminate all their problems. Meanwhile the chief priests and the scribes decided to get rid of Jesus out of their hatred and fear that his influence will cause troubles.

Today the liturgy gently leads us into the mystery of God's love through Jesus' life, suffering, death and resurrection. A few days later at the Last Supper Jesus reveals his true mission. It is a mission of food that is broken and given for his people. It is a mission to be expressed in service dramatized in his washing of the disciple's feet. It is a mission that brings about our redemption through Jesus' willing to be crucified on Good Friday. And this mission is accomplished in His resurrection which is our permanent joy and hope.

We often experience joy, excitement when things go well but grief, sadness, frustration when things do not go well. According to Father Henri Nouwen, it is a very spiritual thing to see the cross as a sign of execution, of pain, of torture at the same time, it is his hope and a source of life for him and it brings him joy. So when we embrace our grief, pain, problems and trust that, right there, we shall find hope, joy and comfort. That's what the cross is all about.

In today's liturgy we are invited to sit with the mysteries of Holy Week (which reach its climax through Easter Tridiuum) and let them talk to us in our silence in order to understand that resurrection means more than coping; it means acceptance and then letting go and starting off again full of new life. It brings us to a real living of life rather than just coping with life's problems. Through our celebration of the Pascal Mystery we are called to open up to a deeper understanding and joy in the new life, in this life (here and now) and in the next.

### Easter eggs

Have you ever wondered why people give each other Easter eggs? The answer lies in the symbolism of the egg. The egg represents new life. For Christians, Easter means new life in Christ. So eggs and Easter have a firm connection. For centuries Christians have decorated eggs (hard-boiled!) as a way of celebrating Christ's Resurrection. In more recent times this practice evolved into giving chocolate eggs to family and friends. Unfortunately, the religious symbolism of the egg has largely been forgotten.
