THE GIFT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Once during a television interview, Mother Teresa was faced with a heckler who said, "You love the poor; that's fine. But how about the immense riches of the Vatican and of the Church, should they be given to the poor?" Mother Teresa's reaction was typical. She looked straight at the interviewer and said, "Sir, you are not a happy man. Something is eating you. You don't have any peace within you." At that he wilted. And she just continued to make him writhe, "You should have some faith."

"And how do I get faith?" he asked. "You should pray."

"But I cannot pray." "Then I'll do it for you. But on your part you should try to give the people around you a smile. A smile touches other people. It brings some of the reality of God into our lives.

Jesus is aware of the harsh realities of the world when he talks in today's gospel about love and peace and about not having fear or trouble in our hearts. "If anyone loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him and make our home with him." To love God is first of all to accept being loved by Him. When we accept this love we become more free from fear and trouble. Being more free from fear we become more free from compulsion and our way of seeing others begins to change. When our way of seeing changes our behavior also begins to change.

Let us pray that we shall listen well to Jesus' word and may we let the Spirit of God dwell within us and guide us towards better behavior.

1823 Jesus makes charity the new commandment. By loving his own 'to the end', he makes manifest the Father's love which he receives. By loving one another, the disciples imitate the love of Jesus which they themselves receive. Whence Jesus says: 'As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love.' And again: 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you.'

When the people you're dealing with today look at you, they are to see a sign of God's presence to and for them. Pray for the grace to be that sign.

Saints of the Week



The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary is the visit of Mary with Elizabeth as recorded in the Gospel of Luke (Lk 1:39-56). It is also the name of a Christian feast day commemorating this visit, celebrated on May 31

Mary visits her relative Elizabeth; they are both pregnant. Mary is pregnant with Jesus and Elizabeth is pregnant with John the Baptist. Mary left Nazareth immediately after the Annunciation and went "into the hill country...into a city of Judah" (Luke 1:39) to attend her cousin Elizabeth. The journey was about 100 miles, and Elizabeth was in the sixth month before Mary came (Luke 1:36). Mary stayed three months and departed just before John was born.

Catholics believe that the purpose of this visit was to bring divine grace to both Elizabeth and her unborn child. Even though he was still in his mother's womb, John became aware of the presence of his Divine Saviour; he leapt for joy as he was cleansed from original sin and filled with divine grace. Elizabeth also responded and recognized the presence of Jesus. Thus Mary, now for the first time, exercised her function as mediatrix between God and man.

Elizabeth remarks to Mary: "And she spoke out with a loud voice, and said, Blessed [art] thou among women, and blessed [is] the fruit of thy womb. And whence [is] this to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For, lo, as soon as the voice of thy salutation sounded in mine ears, the babe leaped in my womb for joy. And blessed [is] she that believed: for there shall be a performance of those things which were told her from the Lord (Luke 1:42-55)"

It is also at this point, in response to Elizabeth's remark, that Mary proclaims the Magnificat (My soul doth magnify the Lord), (Luke 1:46-55), for which reason this canticle had traditionally been reserved for this feast day.

St Justin

St. Justin Martyr (105-165 A.D.) was born a pagan at Flavia Neapolis in Samaria near Jacob's well somewhere between 100-110 A.D. He was well educated and travelled and is known to us mostly by his writings in defence of the faith. He has been

described as "star in the West, leading its Wise Men to the cradle of Bethlehem." Before his conversion he seems to have been enamoured but not satisfied with philosophies like Stoicism and Platonism. Then one day he met an old man on the sea shore and had the Gospel proclaimed to him and realised he could have no true knowledge of God without revelation, which had been given to the prophets. After his conversion, he put his training in philosophy to good use as an evangelist, spending some time in Ephesus and much time in Rome teaching at a Christian philosophy school. It was in Rome where he (and some of his disciples) suffered martyrdom for his bold preaching during the reign of Marcus Aurelius. His Apologies are considered the most important of the 2d century Christian writings of the Fathers of the Early Church. It is difficult not to identify within his testimony an early version of the Catholic Mass. Justin was beheaded by the prefect Rusticus along with six other Christians in Rome.

Some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement, and after Paul and Barnabas had had a long argument with these men it was arranged that Paul and Barnabas and others of the church should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders.

Then the apostles and elders decided to choose delegates to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; the whole church concurred with this. They chose Judas known as Barsabbas and Silas, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them:

'The apostles and elders, your brothers, send greetings to the brothers of pagan birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some of our members have disturbed you with their demands and have unsettled your minds. They acted without any authority from us; and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to you with Barnabas and Paul, men we highly respect who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols; from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.'

Second reading Apocalypse 21:10-14, 22-23 A reading from the book of Apocalypse

In the spirit, the angel took me to the top of an enormous high mountain and showed me Jerusalem, the holy city, coming down from God out of heaven. It had all the radiant glory of God and glittered like some precious jewel of crystal-clear diamond. The walls of it were of a great height, and had twelve gates; at each of the twelve gates there was an angel, and over the gates were written the names of the twelve tribes of Israel; on the east there were three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. The city walls stood on twelve foundation stones, each one of which bore the name of one of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

I saw that there was no temple in the city since the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb were themselves the temple, and the city did not need the sun or the moon for light, since it was lit by the radiant glory of God and the Lamb was a lighted torch for it.
