The Most Holy Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit

Once an earnest young man approached a monk and said, 'Tell me what God is like.' 'Do you see the sun?' the monk began. The student raised his eyes towards the sky, but the monk said, 'No, don't look at it or you'll damage your eyes. Instead, hold out your arm and roll up your sleeve.' The student did as he was directed. 'Do you feel the sun?' asked the monk. 'I do.' Nodded the student, still mystified. 'You think it is very far away, yet you can feel it on your arm.' Said the monk. 'Yes, but what does that have to do with God?' the student asked. 'You want to know what God is like?' 'Yes.' 'Your problem is that you have a cold heart.' 'So what must I do?' 'You must bare your heart to love just as you have bared your arm to the sun. If you do that you will know what God is like.'

Today we celebrate the greatest mystery of our faith, namely, the mystery of the Blessed Trinity. Whenever we make the Sign of the Cross, we show our faith with the three persons in one God. We believe there is only one God, but there are three persons in God. Each person in the Trinity has all the qualities, abilities, and power we can attribute to God; each one is fully God. The Father is the creator and sustainer of the world, the Son is the saviour and reconciler of its sins, and the Holy Spirit is the healer of its wounds and the inspirer of new beginnings. Today's gospel describes what the Spirit would do for the believer. The Spirit will bring a person to the truth, not a philosophic or scientific truth, but a true relationship with the Father through the Son.

Faith in the Trinity is the beginning of our life in the Church. It is also the reason we go out and spread the Good News. Unfortunately, we take the Trinity for granted. Most of the time, we don't seek God's will and guidance. Yes, we affirm our belief in Father, Son, and Spirit, but do we trust God with our immediate future? Do we seek out Jesus to be our personal friend? Are we open to and hope in the work of the Spirit in our lives? As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, let us give glory to the Father who works in our lives. Let us look forward the coming of the Son, both in the Eucharist and at the end of time. And let us also place our hope in the Spirit, our guide in life.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church on the Holy Trinity (232 – 260)

The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life. God alone can make it known to us by revealing himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Father generates the Son; the Son is generated by the Father; the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. God is a community of love of three distinct persons who want to share their love with us. "When you are with everyone but me, you are with no one. When you are with no one but me, you are with everyone" (Rumi).

Saints of the Week

St Aloysius was born in Castiglione, Italy. The first words he spoke were the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary. He was destined for the military by his father, but by the age of 9 Aloysius had decided on a religious life, and made a vow of perpetual virginity. To safeguard himself from

possible temptation, he would keep his eyes persistently downcast in the presence of women. St. Charles Borromeo gave him his first Holy Communion. A kidney disease prevented St. Aloysius from a full social life for a while, so he spent his time in prayer and reading the lives of the saints. Although he was appointed a page in Spain, St. Aloysius kept up his many devotions and austerities, and was quite resolved to become a Jesuit. His family eventually moved back to Italy, where he taught catechism to the poor. When he was 18, he joined the Jesuits, after finally breaking down his father, who had refused his entrance into the order. He served in a hospital during the plague of 1587 in Milan, and died from it at the age of 23, after receiving the last rites from St. Robert Bellarmine. The last word he spoke was the Holy Name of Jesus. St. Robert wrote the Life of St. Aloysius. Feast Day: June 21



St Thomas More was born in London on February 7, 1478. His father, Sir John More, was a lawyer and judge. Thomas More was Oxford educated, a lawyer and served in parliament. For two years, between 1503 and 1504, More lived next to a Carthusian monastery and he found himself called to follow their lifestyle of simple piety. He

often joined their spiritual exercises. He wrote the world famous book "Utopia" and spent many years writing in defence of the Church, for which he was imprisoned. He spent 15 months in the infamous Tower of London before he was executed. Thomas More has been widely remembered as a man of tremendous integrity, and he has since been described as a martyr .
