The narrow door

Many Australians make a decision when voting for a political Party from which a Prime Minister will lead the nation for a term of three years. The result is unpredictable. Then the Prime Minister will give his/her speech addressing and promising the whole nation, at the same time he/she will receive many congratulations for his/her winning. We are living in a world where value and success is often based upon winning, possessions, prestige and power. Even religion sometimes tends to follow this worldly trend. It measures its success by its possessions, the size of its buildings or the number of its followers. The purpose of religion is often seen as getting God on our side so that we can have what we want. It is often concerned with what we can get from God with how we can get God to be on our side and do our wills.

Today in the Gospel, Jesus encouraged his followers "*Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because, I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed.*" Jesus' spiritual wisdom is different to the world. "*the seed must die, if it is to bear fruit.*" "*Forgive your enemies and do good to those who hate you.*" Jesus' message is not popular but for those who have faith and have been enlightened, it is where the true joy exists. It is surely harder to enter the narrow door if we have so much baggage on our back. Spirituality is a letting go of all trappings, all that is unnecessary and to move closer to God's will. In order to grow in spirituality we must detach and we must let go from many barriers that stop us moving towards the one who IS.

In his book 'New seed on Contemplation' (p.31-32) Thomas Merton writes: "Trees and animals have no problem. God makes them what they are without consulting them and they are perfectly satisfied. With us it is different. God leaves us free to be whoever we like. we can be ourselves or not, as we please. We are at liberty to be real, or to be unreal. We may be true or false, the choice is ours. We may wear one mask now and then another, and never, if we so desire, appear with our own true face. But we cannot make these choices with impunity. Causes have effects, and if we lie to ourselves and to others, then we cannot expect to find truth and reality whenever we happen to want them. If we have chosen the way of falsity we must not be surprised that truth eludes us when we finally come to need it." Freedom and truth are the keys. The choices are ours.

Let us reflect on 'the narrow door' of our lives and enter it with joy, hope and love.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

387 Only the light of the divine revelation clarifies the reality of sin and particularly of the sin committed at mankind's origins. Without the knowledge revelation gives of God we cannot recognise sin clearly and are tempted to explain it as merely a developmental flaw, a psychological weakness, a mistake, or the necessary consequence of an inadequate social structure, etc. Only in the knowledge of God's plan for man can we grasp that sin is an abuse of the freedom that God gives to created persons so that they are capable of loving Him and loving one another.

Saints of the Week



St Monica was an early Christian saint and the mother of St Augustine of Hippo. She is remembered and honoured in most Christian denominations, albeit on different feast days, for her outstanding Christian virtues, particularly the suffering

caused by her husband's adultery, and her prayerful life dedicated to the reformation of her son, who wrote extensively of her pious acts and life with her in his *Confessions*. Popular Christian legends recall Saint Monica weeping every night for her son Augustine.

Feast Day: August 27

Patron of wives and abuse victims



St Augustine of Hippo is the patron of brewers because of his conversion from a former life of loose living, which included parties, entertainment, and worldly ambitions. His complete turnaround and conversion has been an inspiration to many who struggle with a particular vice or habit they long to break.

This famous son of St. Monica was born in Africa and spent many years of his life in wicked living and in false beliefs. Though he was one of the most intelligent men who ever lived and though he had been brought up a Christian, his sins of impurity and his pride darkened his mind so much, that he could not see or understand the Divine Truth anymore. Through the prayers of his holy mother and the marvellous preaching of St. Ambrose, Augustine finally became convinced that Christianity was the one true religion. Yet he did not become a Christian then, because he thought he could never live a pure life. After reading the book of the Letters of St. Paul it was just what Augustine needed, for in it, St. Paul says to put away all impurity and to live in imitation of Jesus. That did it! From then on, Augustine began a new life. He was baptized, became a priest, a bishop, a famous Catholic writer, Founder of religious priests, and one of the greatest saints that ever lived. He became very devout and charitable, too.

The Passion of St John the Baptist is seen as the last prophet of the Old Testament and the first prophet of the New, St. John has always been an icon of one who not only spoke the truth but also challenged his hearers with a call to action. He knew that truth always demanded a decision. John the Baptist was

set apart by God from his mother's womb and called by His grace. Even before his birth, he leaped for joy as he came into the presence of the Son of God within Mary's womb. His burden was to awaken the people to this incredible good news letting them know that the one for whom they had been waiting - the Messiah - would be coming soon. St. John the Baptist also wanted to be sure that the way was prepared for His coming - recognizing the way that had to be prepared was not a road of stones and dirt, but a highway of the heart. He called for people to repent and be baptized, washed of the burdens of this life that they could hear the Words of the Master when He came. On this feast day, however, we are focused on martyrdom, his beheading. He died for the faith for which he lived. The consequences of his heralding the good news and a call to righteousness cost him his life. He was condemned by the decree of King Herod. St. John's martyrdom reminds us that the most important vocation for all Christians, Catholic and Protestant alike, is living out the Gospel. We are called to proclaim the Good News of Christ both in word and deed.
