Social Justice: Across my Boundaries

During World War II it obviously wasn't always possible to return fallen soldiers to their homeland for burial. Many lay where they fell & died and are only remembered today by anonymous graves. Fearing this fate for one of their own, a US company fighting in the heart of the French countryside approached a priest to ask if they could bury their fallen colleague in the small, countryside graveyard attached to the church. To their astonishment, the priest turned them down on two grounds — First of all the dead man wasn't a Catholic and secondly there was no room in the already overcrowded graveyard. With heavy hearts the soldiers were left with no other choice than to bury their friend just beyond the small wooden fence that marked the boundary of the cemetery & indicating its presence with a simple cross.

Within a couple of months, the war was over & the company prepared for the journey home. But longing to say one last goodbye to their dead friend, they decided to return once more to the graveyard alongside which they had buried him. On arriving at the church, the cemetery looked much the same but, try as they might, as they walked around the perimeter of the fence, they could not see any sign of the wooden cross they had left to mark the grave. Angered by the belief that the priest had removed even this simple memorial to their fallen buddy, they ran towards the church to challenge him.

However, as they approached, the priest came out to meet them. "I'm so glad you have returned," he said in a welcoming voice. "After you left, I was troubled by my decision. I saw the dignity with which you buried your friend & realised the anguish my decision had caused you. I couldn't change the fact that the cemetery was full, so I decided to solve the problem a different way. I've moved the boundary fence a meter or two so that your friend's grave is now within the graveyard itself. I hope you can forgive me."

Social Justice is about moving the boundary fence built by the current social order so that we can include those outside the gate (fence). In the story about the rich man and Lazarus, Jesus turned the popular images of social status upside down. In the popular mind, the rich were blessed, while the destitute were evidence of God's displeasure. Yet, the poor Lazarus was the saved and the selfish rich man was damned because of his disdain for those beneath him. Learning to recognize patterns in our own life is critical. Jesus illuminates our hearts and minds so that we can see clearly and answer passionately four important questions: who am I? What am I here for? What matters most? What matters least? With these answers and clarity, God then sends us out into the world to live with passion and purpose.



St Jerome was born in 347 in Stridon, Dalmatia, Bethlehem, Palestine and was given the name Eusebius Sophronius Hieronymus. He was a biblical translator and monastic leader, traditionally regarded as the most learned of the

Latin Fathers. He lived for a time as a hermit, became a priest, served as secretary to Pope Damasus I, and about 389 established a monastery at Bethlehem. His numerous biblical, ascetical, monastic, and theological works profoundly influenced the early middle ages. He is know particularly for his Latin translation of the Bible, the Vulgate, and his commentaries on the Gospels. He is considered a doctor of the church. Jerome died on September 30, 420. His death was peaceful and he was laid to rest under the Church of the Nativity. His remains were later transferred to Rome.

Patron: Archaeologists, Biblical scholars, librarians, students and translators.



The Holy Guardian Angels

The Memorial of the Holy Guardian Angels is a memorial of the Catholic Church officially observed on 2 October. Catholics set up altars in honour of guardian angels as early as the 4th Century, and local celebrations of a feast in

honour of guardian angels go back to the 11th Century.

St Therese of the Child

Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, born Marie Françoise-Thérèse Martin, also known as Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face, O.C.D., was a French Catholic Discalced Carmelite nun who devoted her life to loving God . As a

permanent novice, she would never be able to perform great deeds. She did however scatter flowers, each flower a little sacrifice and a little action for God and love. After not feeling well for sometime, she became gravely ill. She remained silent and cheerful until the end and passed away at the age of 24. She is widely venerated in modern times. She is popularly known as "The Little Flower of Jesus" or simply "The Little Flower".

St Francis of Assisi

Saint Francis of Assisi, born Giovanni di Pietro di Bernardone, informally named as Francesco, was a wealthy young man of privilege, served as a soldier and was a prisoner of war. He heard God's call and became a Catholic

friar, deacon and preacher. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of Saint Clare, the Third Order of Saint Francis and the Custody of the Holy Land. He went on to be one of the most venerated Catholic Saints. He designed the first Nativity set and was the first man ever recorded to receive the Stigmata, the wounds of Christ.

said the rich man "but if someone comes to them from the dead, they will repent." Then Abraham said to him, "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead."
