#### THE BAPTISM

An old gentleman walked into the fashionable florist shop. "I want a beautiful corsage," he said, "not a big one, but just about the prettiest one you can make." he smiled broadly. "It's for my granddaughter, and she's having her first date tomorrow." The florist was all curious. "How old is the young lady?" he asked, eyeing his flowers speculatively. "Two weeks old," replied the grandfather. The florist turned in utter amazement. "Did you say... a date... a corsage... two weeks old?". "Precisely", said the old gentleman. "And I want a corsage that's exactly right. She'll never have a more important date than she has tomorrow. My little granddaughter will be baptized."

Today is the feast of 'The Baptism of the Lord' which marked the beginning of Jesus' mission. He felt the call of the Father to become active as a chosen One he went to John the Baptist for baptism. John knew exactly who Jesus was and he tried to dissuade Jesus, "It is I who need baptism from you, and yet you come to me." Jesus confidently listened well to the Father and reached out to fulfill his mission, likewise; John the Baptist knew about his role which was to introduce Jesus to people, he even sent his followers to go with Jesus, and told others to prepare themselves for Jesus' coming. At the river of Jordan, the Spirit of God was seen in the form of a dove and coming down on Him and the Son was affirmed by the voice spoke from heaven. "This is my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on him." This affirmation is rested on each one of us as sons and daughters of the Father when we are baptized with the Holy Spirit.

Let us pray that we may find strength through our baptism to live out our commitments as an intentional disciple of Jesus, and be faithful to the call of the Father in our everyday living.

# Collection at all Masses (Australia Day) for the St Vincent De Paul bushfire appeal

Friends, the sad tragedy of the bushfires has impacted upon our Catholic community across the Archdiocese of Sydney in a very real way. A brave Rural Fire Service volunteer Andrew O'Dwyer was farewelled at a Requiem Mass at Our Lady of Victories Parish in Horsley Park this week. The parish is providing ongoing support to his widow Melissa and 19 month old daughter Charlotte and our prayers are with them. Amidst the devastation of the fires, it has been encouraging to witness the support of so many ordinary Australians, including so many men and women of faith. While much of the response must be at a local parish and diocesan level, such a great crisis also requires a national response. Alongside my brother bishops across the country, I encourage you to donate to a special parish collection at Masses over the Australia Day weekend (25 and 26 January) through the St Vincent De Paul Society. Through this bushfire appeal, you can make a tangible difference in the lives of those affected, whether that be to cover basic clothing or the food bill for a family evacuated from their home. The support may also come through psychological counselling services for families left traumatised by the disaster or financial counselling as they struggle to pay unexpected bills. Together we can offer real comfort and long term support to families left struggling after the bushfires.

# Saints of the Week

St Anthony
St Anthony the Abbot was born in Egypt in the 3rd century AD.

Following the death of his parents when he was about 20, Anthony insured that his sister completed her education, then he sold his house, furniture, and the land he owned and gave the proceeds to the poor. He was a very spiritual

person who believed in living the Jesus life. He became a hermit and lived alone. When people eventually found him, he moved even further away, eating only bread and water, praying, fasting and wearing skins as clothing. Wise men from as far away as Greece sought his guidance. Some were healed physically, many were comforted by his words and others stayed to learn from him. He founded two monasteries on the Nile. He lived until 105 years of age, becoming the most famous monk of ancient Christendom, a noble example of an ascetic life of austerity, sacrifice and extreme solitude.

## The Baptism of the Lord. Feast. 10th January

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Baptism of Our Lord. This brings to an end the season of Christmas. The Church recalls Our Lord's second manifestation or epiphany which occurred on the occasion of His baptism in the Jordan. Jesus descended into the River to



sanctify its waters and to give them the power to beget sons of God. The event takes on the importance of a second creation in which the entire Trinity intervenes.

In the Eastern Church this feast is called Theophany because at the baptism of Christ in the River Jordan God appeared in three persons. The baptism of John was a sort of sacramental preparatory for the Baptism of Christ. It moved men to sentiments of repentance and induced them to confess their sins. Christ did not need the baptism of John. Although He appeared in the "substance of our flesh" and was recognized "outwardly like unto ourselves," He was absolutely sinless and impeccable. He conferred upon the water the power of the true Baptism which would remove all the sins of the world: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold Him Who takes away the sin of the world.'

Many of the incidents which accompanied Christ's baptism are symbolical of what happened at our Baptism. At Christ's baptism the Holy Spirit descended upon Him; at our Baptism the Trinity took its abode in our soul. At His baptism Christ was proclaimed the "Beloved Son" of the Father; at our Baptism we become the adopted sons of God. At Christ's baptism the heavens were opened; at our Baptism heaven was opened to us. At His baptism Jesus prayed; after our Baptism we must pray to avoid actual sin.
