Let Go Of Your Fears

A news story said the police caught a man red handed trying to cash a phoney cheque and took him down to the police station. While the officers were distracted, the crook grabbed the cheque off the desk and swallowed it to get rid of the evidence. No problem: the police waited five or six hours and then charged the guy for passing a bad cheque twice.

When we are doing the right and good thing then we have nothing to be afraid of, we actually want people to know about our action which make us proud of, and we easily make connection with people who know of it. While fear can be very alienating, when we become aware of our wrong and bad doing we tend to isolate ourselves from God and others. We hide ourselves from the truth as a result we imprison ourselves in lies, guilt, anger, panic, compulsive behaviour etc.

In today's Gospel, Jesus encouraged us, "Have no fear; for nothing is covered up that will not be uncovered, and nothing is secret that will not be known." Humans are vulnerable when we don't want others to know about thing which we are not proud of. We also often feel insecured and fear of the unknown, particularly in the last two months there was so much fear about Corona Virus, which effects many people emotionally and mentally. But when we pray we entrust the unknown into God's caring hands then we'll feel secured and our fear will cease to exist. We tend to pray asking God to give us success, promotion, health, power, possessions. All of these are requests to boost the ego and are ultimately seeking security in the wrong place. They are seeking happiness through asking God to deliver us from the suffering that is the normal burden of life, and when God does not grant what we ask we become frustrated and more fearful. Jesus encouraged us fear not in the Gospel for "every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows...."

Let us pray that we can let go of our fear and insecurities as our trust in God is growing and our relationship with God is deepened.

307 To human beings God even gives the power of freely sharing his providence by entrusting them with the responsibility of 'subduing' the earth and having dominion over it. God thus enables men to be intelligent and free causes in order to complete the work of creation, to perfect its harmony for their own good and that of their neighbours.

Parish Collections

I would like to express my appreciation to parishioners who have been so generously supporting the parish especially finance and upkeeping the church during the last two months of restrictions. On a weekly basis the Parish has two regular Collections. I have noticed that some of the parishioners are not sure what the collections mean.

The First Collection

Your contribution for the First Collection on Sundays and your gifts at baptism and marriages together pays priests stipend and their living. If there is any surplus, it is given to the commo pooling of the archdiocese to pay priests in smaller parishes and priests on sick leave.

The Second Collection

The second collection taken during Sunday Masses is for the support of the Parish. Though a lot of the pastoral work of the parish is done by volunteers, there are a number of wages and bills to pay in relation to the running of the Parish responsibility. Our Church and premises always need maintenance work for the upkeep. Yearly building insurance for all buildings including church, presbytery, parish office and car park ground. The secretary's wages are paid from this collection. Second Collection is to support these undertakings. To enable tax deductibility (25%) for the contributors and to make financial planning easy, we have the Planned Giving (envelope) Program. At the end of each financial year all contributors are provided with a receipt. You can either donate through weekly envelopes or authorise the parish office to make periodic deductions from **your credit card which is the best method to be used at this stage**. If you would like to change your method of supporting the parish, please download a credit card authority form which can also be collected from the church or office and return them to the Parish Office. If you would like to join the Planned Giving Program, you may fill in the slip in this Parish Bulletin or visit the Parish Website.

There will be no collection during Mass at this stage, instead there will be two buckets at the entrance of the church or you can use tap and go as well.





St John Fisher was born in Beverly, Yorkshire, and educated at Cambridge. From 1527, this humble servant of God actively opposed the King's divorce proceedings against Catherine. He was imprisoned in the tower in April 1534. A half hour before his execution he opened his New Testament for the

last time and his eyes fell on the following words from St. John's Gospel: "Eternal life is this: to know You, the only true God, and Him Whom You have sent, Jesus Christ. I have given You glory on earth by finishing the work You gave me to do. Do You now, Father, give me glory at Your side". Closing the book, he observed: "There is enough learning in that to last me the rest of my life."

Feast Day: June 22



St Thomas More was born in London on February 7. 1478. His father, Sir John More, was a lawyer and judge. Thomas More was Oxford educated, a lawyer and served in parliament. For two years, between 1503 and 1504, More lived next to a Carthusian monastery and he found himself called to follow their lifestyle of simple piety. He often joined their spiritual exercises.

He wrote the world famous book "Utopia" and spent many years writing in defence of the Church, for which he was imprisoned. He spent 15 months in the infamous Tower of London before he was executed. Thomas More has been widely remembered as a man of tremendous integrity, and he has since been described as a martyr

The Nativity of St John the Baptist

The Feast of the Nativity, or birthday, of St John the Baptist is one of the oldest feasts in the liturgy of the Church and is ranked among the joyous feasts of the year. He was the son of Zechariah and Elizabeth, a cousin of the Blessed Virgin Mary. As Zechariah was ministering in the Temple, an angel brought him the news that Elizabeth would bear a child filled with the

Holy Spirit from the moment of his birth and that "many would rejoice in his birth". He doubted and was struck dumb until John's birth. John began his ministry around the age of 27, wearing a leather belt and tunic of camel hair, living off locusts and wild honey, and preaching a message of repentance to the people of Jerusalem. He converted many, and prepared the way for the coming of Jesus. He Baptised Christ and pointed him out as "the Lamb of God Who takes away the sins of the world", after which he stepped away and told his disciples to follow Jesus. Shortly after, John rebuked King Herod for taking Herodias, the wife of the ruler's brother Philip. In retaliation, John was cast into prison and while there arranged - through his followers - to bear witness to Jesus one last time. John was then beheaded by order of Herod at the instigation of Herodias and his head was brought to her on a platter.
