14th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A) 4th & 5th July, 2020

"IF GOD GIVES YOU THE BURDEN, GOD WILL GIVE YOU THE STRENGTH."

The above quote from St. Josemaria Escriva captures the essence of this Sunday's Gospel. "Come to me all you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens," says Jesus, "and I will give you rest." Those words seem to evoke an intense longing in every person who ever hears them. It is not that Jesus is promising to lift the burden of ordinary responsibilities and day to day life from us. He is speaking of the burden trying to live up to our own demands; of the burden of trying to restrain our wayward desires; of the burden of trying to make ourselves into better people by our own resolute determination.

"Come to me all you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens. Come to me all you who are beating yourselves up over your inability to break yourselves free of sin. Come to me." We so often think we can't come to Jesus until we have got ourselves sorted out, got ourselves sufficiently under control. But Jesus says, "Come to me and let me deal with that." The power of sin over us will not be broken by trying harder, but by pursuing Christ and Christ alone. Jesus is calling us into a personal relationship with him. Has faith become a burden, full of obligations? How can renewing a relationship with Jesus help you?

"Come to me. Take my yoke upon you. My yoke is easy and my burden light" There is a bit of ambiguity here. Jesus plays with the two words "yoke" and "burden / load", for the Jews used to call "load" the divine teaching imparted to pupils, and "yoke" the balancing of the teacher's sentences, which should be learned by heart. The voke of Jesus stood for his Lordship. When someone says "yes" to Jesus, he or she placed Jesus above his or her burdens. Jesus, the patient and humble teacher enables us to see the mercy of God in our own lives and in our own cross. And because of his gentle compassion and his humility, the Lordship of Jesus had the weight of love, uplifting and empowering.

This unequivocal insistence on the indissolubility of the marriage bond may have left some perplexed and could seem to be a demand impossible to realize. However, Jesus has not placed on spouses a burden impossible to bear, or too heavy - heavier than the Law of Moses. By coming to restore the original order of creation disturbed by sin, he himself gives the strength and grace to live marriage in the new dimension of the Reign of God. It is by following Christ, renouncing themselves, and taking up their crosses that spouses will be able to "receive" the original meaning of marriage and live it with the help of Christ. This grace of Christian marriage is a fruit of Christ's cross, the source of all Christian life.

Directives for Churches and Liturgies for the Archdiocese of Sydney under current COVIDSafe restrictions from 1 July 2020

Notice to be posted near church doors and parish websites From Wednesday 1 July 2020: □ churches in the Archdiocese shall be reopened and Sunday Masses resumed
□ the maximum number of people allowed in the church at one time shall be determined by dividing the total area in square metres by four ('The four square metre rule'); the maximum number allowed in this church at the one time is therefore; the parish priest or designated delegate must supervise this
□ this applies to private prayer, Confessions, Masses, Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals, Eucharistic Adoration, the Divine Office, Rosary in common, Bible study etc.
□ contact details of all those entering the church (name and phone number or email address of one adult in each family) must be recorded, either by registering online or signing up at the door
□ current spatial distancing directions (people are asked to keep least 1½m from each other) and hygiene directions (including hand sanitizing and regularly disinfecting the church) must be observed; attendees are to sit only in marked places, to queue at a distance from others, and to take care when coughing or sneezing
□ congregational singing is still suspended and in the Ordinary Form of the Latin Rite in Australia, Holy Communion is normally received in the hand under the form of the Body of Christ only; great care should be taken when exercising the option of Communion on the tongue;
□ those who are unwell or at high risk must not attend (they might ask that Holy Communion be brought to them at home); those over 70 should exercise particular caution
□ as the 4m2 rule and prudential concerns will prevent many of the faithful attending, all but priests continue for the time being to be dispensed from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass; but those who are at low risk of infection and able should do so are exhorted to take all reasonable steps to attend Sunday Mass
□ the faithful who do not attend Sunday Mass should keep Sunday holy by setting aside some time for prayer at home, reading the Scriptures of the day, and/or watching Mass on television or online, asking God for the graces they would normally receive in Holy Communion ('spiritual communion'); they might attend a weekday where possible or pray before the Blessed Sacrament during the week.
Parishioners who wish to attend Masses are required to provide their contact details (name and phone number or email address of one adult in each family) as they enter the Church.

On July 5, 1902, Maria was sitting outside the steps of her home concentrating on sewing Alessandro's shirt when he tried to rape her. Maria cried that it was a mortal sin and warned he would go to hell. St Maria Goretti forgave her attacker on her death bed. One night during his 27 years in prison, her attacker

dreamt of Maria giving him flowers. Upon awakening he repented his life of crime and sought the forgiveness of Maria's mother after his release from prison.

Maria Goretti was beatified by Pope Pius XII in a ceremony at Saint Peter's Basilica on April 27, 1947. Three years later, on June 24, 1950, Maria was declared a saint.

Feast Day: July 6

Patron of youth, young women, purity and victims of rape.



St Benedict was a mere teenager when he left the sinful world to live a life fasting and praying in the desert mountains. After years of prayer, word of his holiness brought nearby monks to ask for his Leadership. He warned them he would be too strict

for them, but they insisted. He set up twelve monasteries in Subiaco where monks lived in separate communities of twelve. Benedict left these monasteries when envious attacks made it impossible to continue the spiritual leadership he had taken.

It was in Monte Cassino he founded the monastery that became the roots of the Church's monastic system. Instead of founding small separate communities he gathered his disciples into one whole community. His own sister, Saint Scholastica, settled nearby to live a religious life.
