Allegiance

One of the greatest American founders meeting at the Federal Convention in 1787 to draw up the United States' constitution was Benjamin Franklin. It was he who urged that the daily proceedings be opened with a prayer. He was so convinced that God governs the affairs of men that he said no empire could rise without God's providence. He quoted from the Bible in the words of Psalm 127, "Unless the Lord build the house, they labour in vain who build it." And so, he asked that the assembly would each morning implore the help of God before proceeding to its business.

Over and over Jesus confronts the hypocrisy of the Pharisees. And always his comments are honest and straightforward. Even the Pharisees admit this: "Master, we know that you are an honest man and teach the way of God in an honest way' High praise, but unfortunately wrongly motivated. "Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?" So, Jesus must answer, "Why do you set this trap for me?" Then he wisely answers them, "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's."

And what is God's? The very first place, the priority in our life. Even Caesar owes his authority to God, whether he recognizes it or not. We do not give to God what is God's: we do not really let the Lord fill us with his power. We put all kinds of obstacles in his way, just as the Pharisees did. We try to find easy substitutes for Christ, but they do not work. The saints, who gave to God what is God's, spent hours daily listening to him, in prayer, in studying the Gospel of Jesus with the inner heart, in following his example carefully.

Theme in the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

Should we pay taxes or not?

2240 - Submission to authority and co-responsibility for the common good make it morally obligatory to pay taxes, to exercise the right to vote, and to defend one's country: Pay to all of them their dues, taxes to whom taxes are due, revenue to whom revenue is due, respect to whom respect is due, honour to whom honour is due. The Apostle exhorts us to offer prayers and thanksgiving for kings and all who exercise authority, "that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life, godly and respectful in every way" (1 Tim 2:2).

The 100 Person Limit and 4m2 Rule

The 4m² rule still determines the maximum number of people per building, but there is **now a restriction to 100 even in those large churches** where the 4m² rule might have allowed for a greater number.

Faith Matters

Evangelisation

We are often told about the importance of evangelisation, but where does one begin? Fruitful evangelisation is based on the twofold principle of spirit and truth. With regard to truth, Christianity is a revealed faith, so it is necessary to receive its truth in order to communicate this truth to others. Therefore, it is important to invest time, insofar as one is able, into learning about the faith from reliable teachers, especially the saints and doctors of the church. Truth alone, however, is not enough. One must also be moved by the Holy Spirit in order to be fruitful. So, one must come to know God personally, especially through devotion to daily prayer and the sacraments, to be moved by God effectively to this work of proclaiming the Gospel. So true evangelisation begins, in fact, with study and prayer, so that this work, as God's work, will be fruitful.

three Sacraments of Initiation, namely: Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. Any Catholic adults (baptised) but not yet confirmed. And those from other Christian denominations are received into full communion with the Catholic Church. The course for the RCIA candidates commences in November 2020.

Saints of the Week



St Paul of the Cross

St. Paul of the Cross was born at Ovada in the Republic of Genoa, January 3, 1694. His infancy and youth were spent in great innocence and piety. He was inspired from on high to found a congregation; in an ecstacy he beheld the habit which he and his companions were to wear. After consulting his

director, Bishop Gastinara of Alexandria in Piedmont, he reached the conclusion that God wished him to establish a congregation in honour of the Passion of Jesus Christ. On November 22, 1720, the bishop vested him with the habit that had been shown to him in a vision, the same that the Passionists wear at the present time. From that moment the saint applied himself to repair the Rules of his institute; and in 1721 he went to Rome to obtain the approbation of the Holy See. At first he failed, but finally succeeded when Benedict XIV approved the Rules in 1741 and 1746. Meanwhile St. Paul built his first monastery near Obitello. Sometime later he established a larger community at the Church of St. John and Paul in Rome. For fifty years St. Paul remained the indefatigable missionary of Italy. God lavished upon him the greatest gifts in the supernatural order, but he treated himself with the greatest rigor, and believed that he was a useless servant and a great sinner. His saintly death occurred at Rome in the year 1775, at the age of eighty-one. He was canonized by Pope Pius IX in 1867.

St John Paul II

Karol J. Wojtyla, known as John Paul II since his October 1978 election to the papacy, was born in Wadowice, a small city 50 kilometres from Cracow, on May 18, 1920. He was the second of two sons born to Karol Wojtyla and Emilia Kaczorowska. His

mother died in 1929. His eldest brother Edmund, a doctor, died in 1932 and his father, a non-commissioned army officer died in 1941. He served as Pope and sovereign of the Vatican City State from 1978 to 2005. He is recognised as helping to end Communist rule in his native Poland and eventually all of Europe. John Paul II significantly improved the Catholic Church's relations with Judaism, Islam, and the Eastern Orthodox Church, and the Anglican Communion. He upheld the Church's teachings on such matter as artificial contraception and the ordination of women, but also supported the Church's Second Vatican Council and its reforms. He was one of the most travelled world leaders in history, visiting 129 countries during his pontificate. As part of his special emphasis on the universal call to holiness, he beatified 1,340 people and canonised 483 saints, more than the combined tally of his predecessors during the preceding five centuries. John Paul II was the second longestserving pope in modern history after Pope Pius IX (1846-1878). He was the first non-Italian pope since the Dutch Pope Adrian VI (1522-1523). He died on 2nd April, 2005. John Paul II's cause for canonisation commenced one month after his death with the traditional five year waiting period waved. His feast day is celebrated on the anniversary of his papal inauguration.


