The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Year B) 5th & 6th June, 2021

The Body & Blood of Christ

A mother was preparing pancakes for her sons John 11, and James 8. The boys began to argue who would get the first pancake. Their mother took the opportunity for a moral lesson. She said to the boys: "if Jesus is here, he would say 'Let my brother have the first pancake. I will wait!" James turned to his older brother and cheekily said, "John, you'll be Jesus. OK?"

Pope Pius XII put it this way: "when we receive worthily, we are what we receive. We are transformed into Christ."

Today we celebrate the Feast of 'The Body and Blood of Christ' which reminds us that Jesus' Body and Blood are given for us. He loved us so much that he was willing born as we are born, grew as we grow and died on the cross for our redemption. He loves us so much that he continues to be with us in the sacraments especially in the Eucharist which we receive Jesus' life under the form of consecrated bread and consecrated wine. According to Henri Nouwen, "The Eucharist can be seen only by those who already love the Lord and believe in his active, loving presence to us." It is like human love which we don't see but love bonds us to those whom we love.

In the movie Armageddon, the character played by Bruce Willis agrees to lead the mission to "nuke" an asteroid threatening the earth. He dies to save his would be son-in-law, to give happiness to his daughter, and to enable the world to survive. His sacrifice imitated Jesus' self giving on the cross. "while they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it and gave it to them and said 'Take it; this is my body', then he took a cup, gave thanks....'This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Do this in memory of me" Jesus calls for discipleship, a deep personal union with him. He wants us to participate in the Eucharist and to share the very life of God.

Let us pray that as the disciples of Jesus and being nourished and sustained by the very life of Jesus Himself, we will carry on Jesus' mission in our world by generously sharing our gifts, talents, time, love and forgiveness with others and always strife for reconciliation and unity.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

1324 The Eucharist is 'the source and summit of the Christian life'. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and oriented towards it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch.'

NSW Restrictions for Churches due to Covid-19

Places of worship are now allowed to have one person per the 2m² with no maximum cap. From Monday, 29 March, no cap on numbers at funerals and weddings, provided a 2m² rule is observed.

Faith Matters

Why are there two Eucharistic species, the host and the chalice, instead of just one?

Jesus Christ – body and blood, soul and divinity – is present in the host and the chalice. As a consequence, one receives Communion fully even when one only consumes the host. Nevertheless, God gives us the body and blood of Christ in distinct forms because we participate in the Eucharist as a sacrifice, not only as a sacrament. Since the Eucharist is a sacrifice, the body and blood are separate on the altar just as the blood of Christ was shed from his body on the cross.

St. Joseph: An Obedient Father

As he had done with Mary, God revealed his saving plan to Joseph. He did so by using dreams, which in the Bible and among all ancient peoples, were considered a way for him to make his will known. In every situation, Joseph declared his own "fiat", like those of Mary at the Annunciation and Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. In his role as the head of a family, Joseph taught Jesus to be obedient to his parents (cf. Lk 2:51), in accordance with God's command (cf. Ex 20:12).

During the hidden years in Nazareth, Jesus learned at the school of Joseph to do the will of the Father. That will was to be his daily food (cf. Jn 4:34). Even at the most difficult moment of his life, in Gethsemane, Jesus chose to do the Father's will rather than his own,[16] becoming "obedient unto death, even death on a cross" (Phil 2:8). The author of the Letter to the Hebrews thus concludes that Jesus "learned obedience through what he suffered" (5:8).

All this makes it clear that "Saint Joseph was called by God to serve the person and mission of Jesus directly through the exercise of his fatherhood" and that in this way, "he cooperated in the fullness of time in the great mystery of salvation and is truly a minister of salvation."

The Eucharist is not just the prayer of the individual, nor of the priest who presides over it, but is truly the prayer of the whole Church gathered to worship God through Jesus, our Saviour and great high priest (Hebrew 7:26; 8:1). The Second Vatican Council's Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (no 10) affirms this when it says the liturgy (the Mass) is the summit towards which the activity of the Church is directed; at the same time it is the fountain from which all her power flows. For the goal of apostolic works is that all who are made children of God by faith and baptism should come together to praise God in the midst of the Church, to take part in her sacrifice, and to eat the Lord's Supper.

All the power of the Church flows from the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. All the church's many activities are brought together and offered to God as a sacrifice of praise in the liturgy of the Mass. The Mas reminds us that all gifts and power in the Church come from God, and to offer all that we do back to God as a pleasing sacrifice by uniting it with the one truly acceptable sacrifice, the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.

He lived an ascetic and celibate life in his last years and devoted much of his time to prayer and good deeds. He organised the distribution of food in the famine of 372.

his interior life and on His threefold love - His divine love, His burning love that fed His human will and His sensible love that affects His interior life.

The Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin

The Immaculate Heart of Mary is a devotional name used to refer to the interior life of the Blessed Virgin Mary, her joys and sorrows, her virtues and hidden perfections, and, above all,

her virginal love for God the Father, her maternal love for her son Jesus, and her compassionate love for all people. The doctrine of the Immaculate Conception teaches that Mary, the mother of Christ, was conceived without sin and her conception was thus immaculate. Mary's sinless conception is the reason why Catholics refer to Mary as "full of grace".

First reading A reading from the Book of Exodus

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.' Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. This' he said 'is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules.'

not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.
