Thank God for the gift of ourselves.

A little girl was praying her prayers a few nights before Christmas when she stopped suddenly and asked her mother questions with a worried look: "What are we presenting God for Christmas? What does God want for Christmas? We smile, but it is an important question. Is God on YOUR Christmas list?

Christmas is the season when we celebrate God's great self-giving to us. We recall the time when the King of Kings became a human being like us in all but sin. We are told in the stories that He was born as Jesus of Nazareth, laid in a manger, visited by shepherds and by wise men from the east. "She gave birth to a son, her first born. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger because there was no room for them at the inn." The Christmas stories tell us that God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten son who emptied himself, taking the form of a servant so that "We can have life to the full". We are to give God the gift of ourselves. The best way to do this is to accept and appreciate the gift of ourselves which God gave to us. The greatest glory that we can give to God is to treasure and respect the self He gave us. In this way we thank and glorify Him. By receiving with gratitude the great gift that God has given us we give Him the very best gift possible. When God gives us Himself He gives us ourselves, selves that are dwelling places of His spirit.

Let us pray that we will accept with gratitude the great gift that God has given to us by living our lives to the full and always feel great about ourselves and feel good about other people as well.

We have been through a very tough two years, still Christmas is a wonderful season to lift up our hearts to give thanks to God for the great gift of His Son who is 'Emmanuel-God is with us'. God loves the world so much that He gave his only Son to the world so that through Jesus Christ, we will share His divine life, which needs to find a place first of all in our own hearts so that we can live and share it with others. Let us use this event to renew and deepen our relationships with God, with our family members and friends. At the same time we are aware of the great needs in our world those who are affected by Covid 19, war and violence, the asylum seekers, those who lack clothing, food, shelter and freedom.

It has been very hard for many people even after the lockdown is lifted, I still experience your kindness, support, care and generosity. I would like to express my sincere thanks to all of you who have shared generously your time, effort and resource in building up our parish and to serve those most in need.

May the hope, joy, peace and love that Christ brings to our world be with you and your family. I wish you and your families many blessings during this Holy Season and a safe and joyous New Year 2022.

Caesar Augustus issued a decree for a census of the whole world to be taken. This census - the first - took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria, and everyone went to his own town to be registered. So Joseph set out from the town of Nazareth in Galilee and travelled up to Judaea, to the town of David called Bethlehem, since he was of David's House and line, in order to be registered together with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. Second reading Hebrews 1:1-6 A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

At various times in the past and in various different ways, God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets; but in our own time, the last days, he has spoken to us through his Son, the Son that he has appointed to inherit everything and through whom he made everything there is. He is the radiant light of God's glory and the perfect copy of his nature, sustaining the universe by his powerful command; and now that he has destroyed the defilement of sin, he has gone to take his place in heaven at the right hand of divine Majesty. So he is now as far above the angels as the title which he has inherited is higher than their own name.

God has never said to any angel: You are my Son, today I have become your father; or: I will be a father to him and he a son to me. Again, when he brings the First-Born into the world, he says: Let all the angels of God worship him.

Gospel John 1:1-18 A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John

In the beginning was the Word: and the Word was with God and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things came to be, not one thing had its being but through him. All that came to be had life in him and that life was the light of men, a light that shines in the dark, a light that darkness could not overpower.

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light. The Word was the true light that enlightens all men; and he was coming into the world. He was in the world that had its being through him, and the world did not know him. He came to his own domain and his own people did not accept him. But to all who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to all who believe in the name of him who was born not out of human stock or urge of the flesh or will of man but of God himself.

The Word was made flesh, he lived among us, and we saw his glory, the glory that is his as the only Son of the Father, full of grace and truth. John appears as his witness. He proclaims: 'This is the one of whom I said: He who comes after me ranks before me because he existed before me.' Indeed, from his fullness we have, all of us, received — yes, grace in return for grace, since, though the Law was given through Moses, grace and truth have come through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God; it is the only Son, who is nearest to the Father's heart, who has made him known.
