The Freedom of Forgiveness

Mr and Mrs. Abdallah captured the hearts of the nation when they decided to forgive the drunk driver who killed their children Antony, 13, Angelina, 12, and Sienna Abdallah, eight, and their cousin Veronique Sakr, 11. The four children, who were walking to get ice cream, died at the scene after they were struck by an out-of-control Ute that mounted a footpath in Oatlands, Sydney's west, on February 1, 2020. Driver Samuel William Davidson has pleaded guilty to four counts of manslaughter over the crash. "My daughter Leana was injured, she was bleeding, and she had to get up and see her brother and her sisters dead in front of her eyes," Leilah said. "Our life has been turned upside down. Our families have been cut into half ... our life has never been the same and will never be the same." However, the family is sharing their pain in a campaign to have some road rules changed. They also want drivers to take more care on the roads and for passengers to be more accountable. "Every decision you make will impact generations," Leila said ."Sometimes you can't look back, you just got to hold that pain and the good times and try your best to keep moving forward. We have forgiven him (drunk driver) so we are able to grieve peacefully."

In today's Gospel Jesus said to his disciples: "love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly." Jesus did not ask his disciples to fall in love with their enemies but rather not to let those who hurt them control their behavior and life. Our normal reaction towards those who hurt us is to hurt them back or to hold on to our hatred towards them. In doing that we are unintentionally imprison ourselves in our pain and hatred that we no longer see joy and hope in life. Unfortunately, we often allow others (most often people who we don't like) determine how we feel and act. It is claimed that 3/4 of heart attacks are caused by anger. If you allow someone to make you angry you are allowing them to control even your health. The question of forgiveness is a most crucial one for all of us. That is why it is the most central, novel and challenging aspect of Christ's teaching. He talks about the need to forgive not just seven times but seventy times seven times. He teaches us to pray, "Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us."

Let us pray that with the grace of God we can entrust all of our burden, grudges, hurt and anger in his hand and we will try to be more forgiving and understanding so that we can live our life in peace and love with others.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

2262 In the Sermon on the Mount, the Lord recalls the commandment, "You shall not kill," and adds to it the proscription of anger, hatred, and vengeance. Going further, Christ asks his disciples to turn the other cheek, to love their enemies. He did not defend himself and told Peter to leave his sword in its sheath.



Feasts of the Week



The Chair of St Peter

The actual chair of Peter in Rome, the wooden throne at St. Peter's Basilica, was given to Pope John VIII by the Holy Roman Emperor Charles the Bald in the year 875. It was enclosed in bronze by the artist Gian Lorenzo Bernini in 1647. This feast day also commemorates the primatial authority of St. Peter. Feast Day February 22



St Polycarp

Polycarp, bishop of Smyrna, disciple of Saint John the Apostle and friend of Saint Ignatius of Antioch, was a revered Christian leader during the first half of the second century.

Saint Ignatius, on his way to Rome to be martyred, visited Polycarp at Smyrna, and later at Troas wrote him a personal letter. The Asia Minor Churches recognized Polycarp's leadership by choosing him as a representative to discuss with Pope Anicetus the date of the Easter celebration in Rome—a major controversy in the early Church.

His *Letter to the Philippians* was a significant foundation of early Christian literature, establishing the role of Apostle Paul and referencing the existence of other texts of the Bible's New Testament. Only one of the many letters written by Polycarp has been preserved, the one he wrote to the Church of Philippi in Macedonia.

Polycarp's dedication to religion ultimately led to his death. He was arrested and killed at the age of 86 by the Romans for refusing to abandon Christianity. He was led into the crowded Smyrna stadium to be burned alive. The flames did not harm him and he was finally killed by a dagger. The centurion ordered the saint's body burned. The "Acts" of Polycarp's martyrdom are the earliest preserved, fully reliable account of a Christian martyr's death. He died in 155.

 What it means to me to be as merciful as the Father is merciful to us us.....

First reading 1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23 A reading from the first book of Samuel

Saul set off and went down to the wilderness of Ziph, accompanied by three thousand men chosen from Israel to search for David in the wilderness of Ziph.

In the dark David and Abishai made their way towards the force, where they found Saul lying asleep inside the camp, his spear stuck in the ground beside his head, with Abner and the troops lying round him.

Then Abishai said to David, 'Today God has put your enemy in your power; so now let me pin him to the ground with his own spear. Just one stroke! I will not need to strike him twice.' David answered Abishai, 'Do not kill him, for who can lift his hand against the Lord's anointed and be without guilt? The Lord forbid that I should raise my hand against the Lord's anointed! But now take the spear beside his head and the pitcher of water and let us go away.' David took the spear and the pitcher of water from beside Saul's head, and they made off. No one saw, no one knew, no one woke up; they were all asleep, for a deep sleep from the Lord had fallen on them.

David crossed to the other side and halted on the top of the mountain a long way off; there was a wide space between them. He called out, 'Here is the king's spear.
