Find our value within

One of the most wonderful sights in front of some old churches is the graveyard which is a good place for us to reflect about the way we live our life. The people who are sleeping there would not respond to whatever happens around, whether you praise or curse them. This is the message of today's Gospel, our value comes from deep within us which gives us true joy not external material things. A spiritual director says, "Nothing external should come between us and true joy which is something interior to us."

In the Gospel today, Jesus warns the seventy two disciples about their attitudes as he sends them out on a mission. He tells them to travel light, "Carry no purse no haversack, no sandals....let your first words be, 'Peace to this house!". By sending the seventy-two on a mission with nothing to rely on but their faith and trust in His word, Jesus reminds us, through his disciples, not to give importance to the baggage we bring, the equipment, the diplomas, the signs of wealth or distinction that mark us as having something that others have not. He knew well that these things only divide people. The more we appear to excel the more we make others ill-at-ease and the more we create jealous reactions. On the other hand, the more we are conscious of and accepting of our own limits the more we find unity as with others and the more we leave space in which to love and be loved by others.

I cannot help feeling good when I hear people praising John the Baptist parish for instant, the largest number of catechists, schools are among the best etc. Of course, I am still the same person whether in this parish or in another not as well established as this parish, yet I tend to take my self valuation from things that are totally external to me. "Even the devils submit to us when we use your name" the disciples did not understand Jesus' message they felt proud by the external signs of their power, which gained them prestige and honour. Their value was in these possessions. Jesus reminds them "Do not rejoice because the spirits submit to you: rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven".

Let us pray that we shall find joy, value within ourselves and may the way we live our life draw us closer to the Lord and the external manifestations are the means for us to achieve this purpose.

Feasts of the Week



St Elizabeth of Portugal was born in 1271, the daughter of Pedro III who would become king of Aragon. From her youth, Elizabeth was a devout child who attended daily mass, prayed regularly, and fasted. She was married at age 12 to Denis, King of Portugal. Though Denis was fond of his young wife, he did not share her

piety and often strayed into sin, resulting in several illegitimate children. These children were lovingly cared for by Elizabeth along with her own two children. Elizabeth served as peacemaker between her son and husband, resulting in their ultimate reconciliation. Denis, too, was the object of many of her peace endeavours. Elizabeth long sought peace for him with God, and was finally rewarded when he gave up his life of sin. He apologized to his wife in front of everyone and began to have a great respect for her. In his last sickness, she never left his side, except for Mass, until he died a holy death. After Denis' death in 1325, Elizabeth retired to the convent of the Poor Clares, which she had founded in 1314 and lived for eleven more years, doing even greater charity and penance and devoted the rest of her life to the poor and sick. Feast Day: July 4



St Anthony Zaccaria was born in 1502 in Cremona, Italy, Anthony became a medical doctor. In 1528 he was ordained a priest and cofounded the Barnabites, the religious congregation so called because it was headquartered in St. Barnabas Monastery in Milan.

The Barnabite's occupied the monastery in 1538, having been approved in 1533. Anthony popularised the forty-hour prayer ceremony, promoted the use of altar sacraments, and introduced the ringing of church bells on Friday. He died in 1539.

Feast Day: July 5



St Maria Goretti

On July 5, 1902, Maria was sitting outside the steps of her home concentrating on sewing Alessandro's shirt when he tried to rape her. Maria cried that it was a mortal sin and warned he would go to hell. He stabbed her 14 times. St Maria Goretti forgave her attacker on her death bed. One night during his 27 years in prison, her attacker dreamt of

Maria giving him flowers. Upon awakening he repented his life of crime and sought the forgiveness of Maria's mother after his release from prison. Maria Goretti was beatified by Pope Pius XII in a ceremony at Saint Peter's Basilica on April 27, 1947. Three years later, on June 24, 1950, Maria was declared a saint.

Feast Day: July 6



St Augustine Zhao Rong was a Chinese soldier who accompanied Bishop John Gabriel Taurin Dufresse of the Paris Foreign Mission Society to his martyrdom in Beijing. Not long after his baptism Augustine was ordained as a diocesan priest. He

was martyred in 1815. Feast Day: July 9
Forced to operate secretly 120 martyrs died between1648 and 1930. Eighty seven of them were born in China, and were children, parents, catechists or labourers, ranging in age from 9 to 72 years. This group includes 4 Chinese diocesan priests.

Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road.

'Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house.
