#### Immanuel: God is with us!

In the past six months, I was blessed with the opportunity to minister to patients at a local hospital. From this experience, I realised that one of the deepest sufferings we can experience is feeling isolated and alone. I learned that, many times, it is not the pain that makes sickness unbearable: it is the fact that our sickness isolates us from our loved ones. I learned that we, as human beings, long for someone to be with us.

The Good News is that God knows very well our longing and seeks to satisfy it. This is why the prophet Isaiah, in our first reading, called Christ as Immanuel, meaning 'God is with us'. Reading through the Bible, we can encounter three stages in which God seeks to relate and be with us.

From the creation account in Genesis, we encounter a God who walks and converses with Adam and Eve. Here, we encounter the first stage: a God who is among us. However, this is not sufficient. God Loves us so much that he seeks to be with us more intimately: he wants to be one of us. Thus, in the Gospels, we encounter Jesus: the God-made-man who relates with us as a fellow human being. Again, this is not sufficient. When one Loves, one strives to be united in the most intimate way. Thus, in his last days on earth, Jesus instituted the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Through this Sacrament, humanity consumes God and thus be fully united to God. This is the third stage: God becomes one with us.

God among us, God as one of us, God as one with us. My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, every time we hear the name 'Immanuel', may we be reminded that we are never alone. Our God is a Loving God, and he is with us!

Festivities begin at 7pm with Christmas market stalls, food, fun activities for the kids and live entertainment.



### First reading A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The Lord spoke to Ahaz and said, 'Ask the Lord your God for a sign for yourself coming either from the depths of Sheol or from the heights above.' 'No,' Ahaz answered 'I will not put the Lord to the test.'

'Listen now, House of David: are you not satisfied with trying the patience of men without trying the patience of my God, too? The Lord himself, therefore, will give you a sign. From Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus who has been called to be an apostle, and specially chosen to preach the Good News that God promised long ago through his prophets in the scriptures.

This news is about the Son of God who, according to the human nature he took was a descendant of David: it is about Jesus Christ our Lord who, in the order of the spirit, the spirit of holiness that was in him, was proclaimed Son of God in all his power through his resurrection from the dead. Through him we received grace and our apostolic mission to preach

the obedience of faith to all pagan nations in honour of his name. You are one of these nations, and by his call belong to Jesus Christ. To you all, then, who are God's beloved in Rome, called to be saints, may God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ send grace and peace.

## Gospel Matthew 1:18-24 A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew

This is how Jesus Christ came to be born. His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph; but before they came to live together she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph; being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.' Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and they will call him Emmanuel,

a name which means 'God-is-with-us.' When Joseph woke up he did what the angel of the Lord had told him to do: he took his wife to his home.
