God's glorious presence

On a mountain climbing expedition, an Australian guide warned the tourists, "Be especially careful not to fall, this is a dangerous place. But if you do fall," he added nonchalantly, "remember to look to the right, the view is absolutely beautiful."

St Matthew tells us in today's Gospel that 'Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain. He was transfigured before them.' They were overcome with joy. This was to be a beautiful memory that would sustain them in the more difficult times ahead. Peter wanted to build 'three dwellings' to freeze the moment of presence. The poet William Blake said, "He who binds himself to a joy, does the winged life destroy, but he who kisses the joy as it flies, lives in eternity's sunrise."

On the mountain Jesus gave the three disciples a glimpse of his inner glory. He was the new Moses - the new law-giver. He was the new Isaiah the one who spoke the word of God. He was the word made flesh, the God who had come among us, in whom the Father was well pleased. On this event the true nature of Jesus is shown in order to strengthen and sustain his disciples' faith in him.



Lent invites us to experience God's glorious presence through prayers and conversion. Maybe we do not always fully recognise our mountaintop experiences, we write them off as insignificant and trivial compared with all the important and urgent things we have to do. Still, Jesus wants us to see his glory, so that we can cling to that experience in moments of doubt, despair or anguish.

Let us pray that we will be attentive to Jesus' presence within us and around us and may this experience transform our moments of suffering, fear, sickness and even death into moments of hope, joy and Christ's resurrection.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

556... the Transfiguration 'is the sacrament of the second regeneration': our own resurrection. From now on we share in the Lord's resurrection through the Spirit who acts in the sacraments of the Body of Christ. The transfiguration gives us a foretaste of Christ's glorious coming, when he 'will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body.' But it also recalls that 'it is through many persecutions that we must enter the kingdom of God'.

Something to give up for lent:

Give up harsh words: use gentle ones. Give up anger: take up peace.

Give up pessimism: take up hope. Give up complaining: value what you already have. Give up bitterness: fill your heart with joy. Give up selfishness: take up compassion.

Give up being unforgiving: learn reconciliation.

Give up stress: take up prayer.

Give up condemning others: discover Jesus within them.

Give up worrying: take up trust in God.



FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The law of fasting binds those who have completed their 18th year, until the beginning of their 60th year; the law of abstinence (from items made with meat - includes all the Fridays of Lent) binds those who have completed their 14th year (CCL 97, 1251-52).

Something to think about.

The traditional focuses in Lent are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The three go together. Pray is essential to the Christian life because in prayer we open ourselves to the presence of God and God leads us to be more aware of others. One good way to pray is to take the Lenten Sunday Gospel and use it as a basis for prayer throughout the week. The word of God becomes formative in our lives.

Fasting is not popular but it is a way of denying our selfish ambitions and desires and again making us more sensitive to the needs of others. The true Lenten fast is a fast from sin and selfishness and this finds expression in a fast from food and drink.







There in their presence he was transfigured: his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this the disciples fell on their faces overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order, 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'
