

# Holy Week

Lent reaches its climax during Holy Week which begins with Palm Sunday (Passion Sunday). On Palm Sunday Jesus was triumphantly welcomed into Jerusalem. This was a dramatic summing up of the earlier expectations of the people about Jesus. It is superficial and temporary, the people wanted a king who would be popular and who would use miraculous powers to eliminate their problems particularly get rid of the Roman domination. A few days later at the last supper Jesus reveals his true mission. It is a mission to be food that is broken and given for his people. It is a mission to be expressed in service and dramatized in his washing of the disciples' feet. This is a mission that is rejected when Jesus is crucified on Good Friday. Jesus' real mission and kingship will be vindicated in his resurrection. It will be a permanent victory and presence to be shared with all people. "The Good Shepherd lays down his life for his friends." This passage reminds us of St Maximilian Kolbe's life who willing died in place of a condemned prisoner.

Holy Week calls us to accompany Christ on his final journey by bearing our own crosses in trusting silence. According to Henri Nouwen: "In the world sadness and gladness are always separate, but in spiritual life they are all of a piece. In the world if you're sad, you cannot be glad. If you're glad, you cannot be sad - be happy and forget your



During this Holy Week, let us meditate and enter into the Pascal Mystery, in order to die to self and rise again with Christ.

#### Easter eggs

Have you ever wondered why people give each other Easter eggs? The answer lies in the symbolism of the egg. The egg represents new life. For Christians, Easter means new life in Christ. So eggs and Easter have a firm connection. For centuries Christians have decorated eggs (hard-boiled!) as a way of celebrating Christ's Resurrection. In more recent times this practice evolved into giving chocolate eggs to family and friends. Unfortunately, the religious symbolism of the egg has largely been forgotten.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The law of fasting binds those who have completed their 18th year, until the beginning of their 60<sup>th</sup> year; the law of abstinence (from items

made with meat - includes all the Fridays of Lent) binds those who have completed their 14<sup>th</sup> year (CCL 97, 1251-52).





This year it is being held in Lisbon, Portugal with the theme that "Mary arose and went with haste" which encouraged us to do the same and go on this journey.
