Easter - A time for love

There was a domestic argument. Father and mother exchanged heated loud words. The children were dumbfounded. Then suddenly the 12 year old girl ran upstairs, took out her mobile phone and rang her parents' number. The father took the call and was astounded to hear a feminine voice say, "Good evening, sir. I'm a reporter and am doing a survey for one of the magazines. Do you love your wife?" The father is taken completely off guard, stuttered and stammered, "Yes. Of course...naturally." Then he called out to his wife, "Jenny, come here a minute." The girl again asked, "Excuse me, but I'm gathering statistics for a study. Could you tell me, do you love your husband?" As she answered "Yes", she recognized her own daughter's voice... "Thank you," said the voice at the other end... After that the father took out his handkerchief and wiped the sweat off his forehead, sank into a chair and said, "Jenny, what we need is a cup of coffee."

Today's Gospel says "Anybody who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me; and anybody who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I shall love him and show myself to him." Jesus wants us to feel God's love by keeping his commandments. Unfortunately, we often portray God as a harsh judge who demands discipline and who will punish us if we do not behave. This understanding tends to make God part of the problem instead of part of the solution when we are in crisis. But today we are told of another mode of God's presence which Christ left with us. "The Spirit of Truth...he is with you, he is in you." Jesus presented a God who is more intimate to us than we are to ourselves. This God is the bedrock of our being, or in computer terms, the default mode of our being. When we remove all the garbage and fear, all the artificial settings and try to live Jesus' commandments, we find the Spirit God at the centre of our being. Living Jesus' commandments calls us to claim God's eternal love for ourselves so that we can live our temporal loves - for parents, brothers, sisters, teachers, friends, spouses, and all people who become part of our lives.

Let us pray that we can understand more about God's perfect and unconditional love so that we can truly open and show our love towards others.



A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them.
