God is within us.

When I was a child of about 4 or 5 year old, my dad was asked to be a guest speaker at a Church one Sunday evening. By way of bribery my dad had told me before arriving at the Church that if I was a good and well-behaved boy he would take me to McDonalds after Mass. During my dad's fiery reflection on the destination of the good vs. the evil he asked, in a loud voice, "And where do you think those that live a pure, just and good life before the Lord are going to go?" with all my excitement I stood in my seat and called out "to McDonalds!"

Today we celebrate the Feast of our Lord's Ascension, Jesus telling his disciples about his departure. Matthew did not give much detail but "All authority," he said, "in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make

disciples of all nations; baptise them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commandments I gave you, and know I am with you always to the end of time." Jesus did not give a constitution or even a stack of memos to guide his disciples, except a promise "I am with you always." And I believe that he will keep his promise. Ascension marks the event of Jesus' leaving. But his leaving does not mean that he ceases to be present. Thus, it is joy, not pain that fills our hearts. Above all, Jesus challenges us to go and continue his work and mission. We are called to live his commandments and teach them to all people. We are the witnesses of what Jesus did and said.

Let us pray that we are not simply looking at a God who has ascended into heaven but we believe in

a God who lives in our hearts through his spirit and as believers we are called to respond to a God who is here, not longing for a God who is out there.



659 'So then the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven, and sat down at the right hand of God.'...Jesus' final apparition ends with the irreversible entry of his humanity into divine glory, symbolised by the cloud and by heaven, where he is seated from that time forward at God's right hand.

How is conscience described? The word conscience is derived from the Latin word to know. Conscience is a type of knowledge. It is not a feeling or an emotion or a "gut feeling" or a personal opinion. Conscience is our knowledge of right and wrong. It is also our ability to apply this knowledge in our lives.

St. Philip Neri born in Florence (Italy) in 1515. An outstanding proponent of Church reform after the Council of Trent. Worked among the young and the poor in Rome and founded the Congregation of the Oratory. Many people wrongly feel that such an attractive and jocular personality as Philip's

cannot be combined with an intense spirituality. Philip's life melts our rigid, narrow views of piety. His approach to sanctity was truly catholic, all-embracing, and accompanied by a good laugh. Remembered as a spiritual director, for his pastoral initiatives, and for his humour, simplicity, and charity. Died at Rome on this day in 1595.

Feasts of the Week



St Rita of Cascia was born Margherita Lotti in Roccaporena, Italy in 1381. She forced into an arranged marriage with a terrible man. She was mistreated for years. After 12 years of marriage, her husband was killed and her 2 sons died shortly after. She entered the convent and followed a life of charity. After praying to Our Lord to "let her suffer like you," she was struck in the

forehead with a thorn from the crucifix. The wound never healed and cause her pain until the day she died on May 22, 1457. Following her death, she was buried at the basilica of Cascia, and was later discovered to be incorrupt. Feast day: May 22



Our Lady Help of Christians

The Virgin Mary has often been invoked in times of religious strife under the title of Help of Christians. In thanksgiving for the release of Pope Pius VII from captivity in 1814, the feast was established the following

year on the anniversary of his restoration. The first Australian provincial synod held in Sydney in 1844 placed the Church in Australia under Mary's patronage invoked by the title Help of Christians. The solemn feast is an occasion to seek Mary's help and protection for our Church and nation. Feast Day: May 24



St. Bede the Venerable was born in Jarrow, United Kingdom, Bede is one of the few saints honored as such even during his lifetime. His writings were filled with such faith and learning. Though his History is the greatest legacy Bede has left us, his work in all the

sciences, especially in Scripture, should not be overlooked.
During his last Lent, Bede worked on a translation of the Gospel of Saint John into English, completing it the day he died in 735.

Gregory VII Born Hildebrand c. 1020 in Tuscany, Pope/ St. Gregory VII was one of the great church reformers. Elected pope in 1073, Hildebrand took the name Gregory in honor of St. Gregory the Great and began to institute reforms against simony, clerical marriage (and/ or unchastity), and lay investiture. Gregory die

in Salerno in 1085, and Paul V canonized him in 1606. Feast Day: May 25



St. Mary Magdalene de' Pazzi born in Florence, Italy, 1566, Mary Magdalene de' Pazzi was so generously given this special gift of God that she is called the "ecstatic saint." Mystical ecstasy is the elevation of the spirit to God in such a way that the person is aware of

this union with God while both internal and external senses are detached from the sensible world. She read the thoughts of others and predicted future events. During her lifetime, Mary Magdalene appeared to several persons in distant places and cured a number of sick people. Feast Day: May 25



St Augustine of Canterbury

Augustine of Canterbury was a Benedictine monk who became the first Archbishop of Canterbury in the year 597. He is considered the "Apostle to the English" and a founder of the English Church. He died in 604AD. Feast Day: May 27






Thank you to everyone who so kindly supported the stall last weekend.

First reading A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'
