Let Go Of Your Fears

A news story said the police caught a man red handed trying to cash a phoney cheque and took him down to the police station. While the officers were distracted, the crook grabbed the cheque off the desk and swallowed it to get rid of the evidence. No problem: the police waited five or six hours and then charged the guy for passing a bad cheque twice.

When we are doing the right and good thing then we have nothing to be afraid of, we actually want people to know about our action which make us proud

of, and we easily make connection with people who know of it. While fear can be very alienating, when we become aware of our wrong and bad doing we tend to isolate ourselves from God and others. We hide ourselves from the truth as a result we imprison ourselves in lies, guilt, anger, panic, compulsive behaviour etc.

In today's Gospel, Jesus encouraged us, "Have no fear; for nothing is covered up that will not be uncovered, and nothing is secret that will not be known." Humans are vulnerable when we don't want others to know about thing which we are not proud of. We also often feel insecured and fear of the unknown, particularly



during 2020-21 there was so much fear about Corona Virus, which effects many people physically, emotionally and mentally. But when we pray we entrust the unknown into God's caring hands then we'll feel secured and our fear will cease to exist. We tend to pray asking God to give us success, promotion, health, power, possessions. All of these are requests to boost the ego and are ultimately seeking security in the wrong place. They are seeking happiness through asking God to deliver us from the suffering that is the normal burden of life, and when God does not grant what we ask we become frustrated and more fearful. Jesus encouraged us fear not in the Gospel for "every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows...."

Let us pray that we can let go of our fear and insecurities as our trust in God is growing and our relationship with God is deepened.

St Pope John Paul (1920-2005)

Feasts of the Week



St Cyril of Alexandria, was born in Alexandria, Egypt. He was the Patriarch of Alexandria from 412 to 444. He was enthroned when the city was at the height of its influence and power within the Roman Empire. A theologian who wrote extensively and was a leading antagonist in the Christological controversies of the late 4th and 5th centuries. He was declared a doctor of the Church by Pope Leo XIII in 1882.

Feast Day: June 27



Saint Irenaeus was a Greek bishop noted for his role in guiding and expanding Christian communities in what is now the south of France.

His early writings entitled him to a high place among the fathers of the Church and laid the foundations of Christian Theology. Originating from Smyrna he had

seen and heard the preaching of Polycarp, the last known living connection with the Apostles, who in turn was said to have heard John the Evangelist.

Feast Day: June 28



St Peter also known as Simon Peter, had humble beginnings and became one of the Twelve Apostles. He was the first Apostle to perform miracles in the name of the Lord. He was instrumental in bringing the Gospel to the Gentiles. Peter is considered the first Pope.

Feast Day: June 29



St Paul is one of the most important and influential of all the saints. He even presided over the persecutions of the early Christians and was present at the martyrdom of St. Stephen. St Paul was converted from Judaism on the road to Damascus. He was the ultimate missionary, travelling throughout many countries and lands, preaching the Gospel of Jesus. He established numerous Churches during his travels

and was even imprisoned several times.

Feast Day: June 29



First Martyrs of Holy Roman Church

The holy men and women are also called the "Protomartyrs of Rome." They were accused of burning Rome by Nero, who burned Rome to cover his own crimes. Some martyrs were burned as living torches at evening banquets, some

crucified, others were fed to wild animals. These martyrs died before Sts. Peter and Paul, and are called "disciples of the Apostles. . . whom the Holy Roman church sent to their Lord before the Apostles' death."




CONFIRMATION 2023

Second reading Romans 5:12-15 A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law.

Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.
