Freedom through Detachment

A gambler, who often lost in one moment more than he earned in a week, usually while walking his dog stopped at a club and played poker machines. A friend met him one day at the club without the dog and wondered what had happened to the dog. The man replied, "The last time I brought him to the club at which I lost all the money, he got a hard kick that he has not forgotten it, and nothing will make him go to the club again." "Then your dog is wiser than his master, who so often facing the pain of loosing but returns again and again to the same place." said his friend.

It always hard to detach from what or whom we know so well, but life is a journey not a destination. If we hold on to anything and are unwilling to let go we can not move on in life. We will be imprisoned in the same situation without freedom to choose and decide what to do with our life.

In today's Gospel Jesus tells us that we must detach

ourselves from our families if we are to follow him. "Anyone who prefers father or mother to me is not worthy of me." He also says, "anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it." It is like every year when the Kindy children begin their primary school, they have to let go of their parents and joining their class in order to learn and develop their personality. The more they let go the more freedom they become who they are. When parents allow their children the freedom to detach from them, the relationship is deepened in meaning rather than dependency. What is imposed can never be true relationship. Jesus calls his disciples to detach from all things and especially from our families. Having detached from them we will be free to love and having a meaningful relationship with them. So that when we are called to commit our life on God's work and separate ourself from all distractions we can achieve more than what we expected and the joy of fulfilment. Even when we don't get what we expected we will get on with our life without so much pain.

Let us pray that we can put our trust in God's providence, and with courage to reach out to do God's work without much calculation of the cost involved.

Feasts of the Week



St Thomas was born a Jew and was called to be one of the twelve Apostles. He was a dedicated but impetuous follower of Christ. At the Last Supper, when Christ told His disciples that He was going to

prepare a place for them to which they also might come because they knew both the place and the way, Thomas pleaded that they did not understand and received the beautiful assurance that Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Thomas, unwilling to believe other apostles had seen the Risen Lord, he earned the title "doubting Thomas." On Christ's second apparition Thomas saw the wounds in our Lord's hands and side and proclaimed "My Lord and my God."

Feast Day: July 3



St Elizabeth Of Portugal was born in 1271, the daughter of Pedro III who would become king of Aragon. From her youth, Elizabeth was a devout child who attended daily mass, prayed regularly, and fasted. She was married at age 12 to Denis, King of Portugal. Though Denis was fond of his young wife, he did not

share her piety and often strayed into sin, resulting in several illegitimate children. These children were lovingly cared for by Elizabeth along with her own two children. Elizabeth served as peacemaker between her son and husband, resulting in their ultimate reconciliation. Denis, too, was the object of many of her peace endeavours. Elizabeth long sought peace for him with God, and was finally rewarded when he gave up his life of sin. He apologized to his wife in front of everyone and began to have a great respect for her. In his last sickness, she never left his side, except for Mass, until he died a holy death. After Denis' death in 1325, Elizabeth retired to the convent of the Poor Clares, which she had founded in 1314 and lived for eleven more years, doing even greater charity and penance and devoted the rest of her life to the poor and sick. St Anthony Zaccaria was born in 1502 in Cremona, Italy, Anthony became a medical doctor. In 1528 he was ordained a priest and cofounded the Barnabites, the religious congregation so called because it was headquartered in St. Barnabas Monastery in Milan.

The Barnabites occupied the monastery in 1538, having been approved in 1533. Anthony popularised the forty-hour prayer ceremony, promoted the use of altar sacraments, and introduced the ringing of church bells on Friday. He died in 1539.

St Maria Goretti

On July 5, 1902, Maria was sitting outside the steps of her home concentrating on sewing Alessandro's shirt when he tried to rape her. Maria cried that it was a mortal sin and warned he would go to hell. He stabbed her 14 times. St Maria Goretti forgave her attacker on her death bed. One night during his 27 years in prison,

her attacker dreamt of Maria giving him flowers. Upon awakening he repented his life of crime and sought the forgiveness of Maria's mother after his release from prison. Maria Goretti was beatified by Pope Pius XII in a ceremony at Saint Peter's Basilica on April 27, 1947. Three years later, on June 24, 1950, Maria was declared a saint. Feast Day: July 6

First reading 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16 A reading from the second book of the Kings

One day as Elisha was on his way to Shunem, a woman of rank who lived there pressed him to stay and eat there. After this he always broke his journey for a meal when he passed that way. She said to her husband, 'Look, I am sure the man who is constantly passing our way must be a holy man of God. Let us build him a small room on the roof, and put him a bed in it, and a table and chair and lamp; whenever he comes to us he can rest there.' One day when he came, he retired to the upper room and lay down. He said to his servant Gehazi, 'Call our Shunammitess. Tell her this: "Look, you have gone to all this trouble for us, what can we do for you? Is there anything you would like said for you to the king or to the commander of the army?" But she replied, 'I live with my own people about me.' 'What can be done for her then?' he asked. Gehazi answered, 'Well, she has no son and her husband is old.' Elisha said, 'Call her.' The servant called her and she stood at the door. This time next year,' he said 'you will hold a son in your arms.'

But we believe that having died with Christ we shall return to life with him: Christ, as we know, having been raised from the dead will never die again. Death has no power over him any more. When he died, he died, once for all, to sin, so his life now is life with God; and in that way, you too must consider yourselves to be dead to sin but alive for God in Christ Jesus.
