Find Rest Through God

In his letters St. Francis de Sales tells about a custom of the country districts in which he lived. He had often noticed a farm servant going across a farmyard to draw water at the well. He also noticed that, before she lifted the brimming pail, the girl always put a piece of wood into it. One day he went out to the girl and asked her, "Why do you do that?" She looked surprised and answered, as if it were a matter of course, "Why? To keep the water from spilling, to keep it steady." Writing to a friend later on, the bishop told this story and added, "So when your heart is distressed and agitated, put the Cross into its centre to keep it steady."

In today's Gospel Jesus says, "Come to me, all you who labour and are overburdened, and I will give you rest. Shoulder my yoke and learn from me..." Through the words and deeds and life of Jesus, it is easy to see that suffering is a part of a human life. What makes us great and special is not the avoidance of suffering but how we cope with it. Jesus does not promise us that he will take away our sufferings (his own was not taken away 'Father, if you are willing, take this cup away from me. Nevertheless, let your will be done, not mine.') But he assures us that he will make our burdens light: "My yoke is easy and my burden light."



Though easy and light it will still be burden! That is why we are invited to be humble and be like little children who can put ourselves and our problems in God's hands. When we grow older we tend to exchange a child's dependence on people for an adult's dependence on things, like money, alcohol and drugs etc. Therefore, prayer should be helping us to let go, to be open to God, to God's will, to become voluntarily dependent on God.

Let us pray for the grace of humility to accept our creature-status so that we will learn to entrust our worries, burdens, problems in God's hands in order to find 'rest for our souls'.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

2779 Humility makes us recognised that 'no one knows the Son except the Father. and no one knows the Father except the Son and any one to whom the Son chooses to reveal him', that is, 'to little children'. The purification of our hearts has to do with paternal or maternal images, stemming from our personal and cultural history, and influencing our relationship with God...

St Benedict was a mere teenager when he left the sinful world to live a life fasting and praying in the desert mountains. After years of prayer, word of his holiness brought nearby monks to ask for his leadership. He warned them he would be too strict for them, but they insisted. He set up twelve monasteries

in Subiaco where monks lived in separate communities of twelve. Benedict left these monasteries when envious attacks made it impossible to continue the spiritual leadership he had taken.

It was in Monte Cassino he founded the monastery that became the roots of the Church's monastic system. Instead of founding small separate communities he gathered his disciples into one whole community. His own sister, Saint Scholastica, settled nearby to live a religious life.

In Latin the meaning of the name Benedict is: blessed. From benedictus meaning blessed. Famous bearers: 6th-century Italian saint Benedict of Nursia founded the Benedictine order of monks and nuns. Feast Day: July 11



St Henry was born in 972. He received an excellent education under the care of St. Wolfgang, Bishop of Ratisbon. In 995, St. Henry succeeded his father as Duke of Bavaria, and in 1002, upon the death of his cousin, Otho III, he was elected emperor. Firmly

anchored upon the great eternal truths, which the practice of meditation kept alive in his heart, he was not elated by this dignity and sought in all things, the greater glory of God. He was most watchful over the welfare of the Church and exerted his zeal for the maintenance of ecclesiastical discipline through the instrumentality of the Bishops. He gained several victories over his enemies, both at home and abroad, but he used these with great moderation and clemency. In 1014, he went to Rome and received the imperial crown at the hands of Pope Benedict VIII. The humility and spirit of justice of the Saint were equal this zeal for religion. Both he and his wife, St. Cunegundes, lived in perpetual chastity, to which they had bound themselves by vow. The Saint made numerous pious foundations, gave liberally to pious institutions and built the Cathedral of Bamberg. His holy death occurred at the castle of Grone, near Halberstad, in 1024. Feast Day: July 13



St Camillus de Lellis was a Roman Catholic priest from Italy who founded the Camillians, a religious order dedicated to the care of the sick. He was beatified by Pope Benedict XIV in the year 1742, and

canonized by him four years later in 1746. Feast Day: July 14



St Bonaventure

France) on this day in 1274. He joined the Franciscans when studying in Paris and eventually became minister general of the order. Later appointed cardinal-bishop of Albano and died assisting Pope Gregory X during the Council of Lyons. Known

as the "Seraphic Doctor". Remembered as a teacher, for his extensive biblical and mystical writings, and for his holiness, gentleness, and compassion.
