Be wise & honest

One of two women riding on a bus suddenly realised she hadn't paid her fare. "I'll go right up and pay it," she said. "Why bother?" her companion replied. "You got away with it, so what?" "I've found that honesty always pays," the other said virtuously, and went up to pay the driver. "See, I told you honesty pays!" she said when she returned. "I handed the driver \$10 and he gave me \$17 change."

In the Gospel today, Jesus castigates the Scribes and Pharisees who "do not practise what they preach." "Everything they do is done to attract attention, like wearing broader phylacteries and longer tassels, like wanting to take place of honour at banquets and front seats in the synagogues, being greeted obsequiously in the market squares and having people call them Rabbi." We are

often shocked when we discover good people that are bogus, phoney, and plastic. But if we honestly, and deeply self-reflect about ourselves then we will certainly discover some parts in us are bogus. As we grow up we learn that it is not socially acceptable to show ourselves for what we are in the raw, so we do it subtly. We often do or say one thing when our meaning or purpose may be contrary. We become Pharisees. It takes great courage and deep understanding to recognise and cure the Pharisee's pretence within us. It's always



very uncomfortable to name something we don't like about ourselves. But like Jesus who said that the truth will sets us free.

Let us pray for the gifts of wisdom and honesty to discover the bogus and phoney in ourselves. May we accept the darker side of ourselves so that we can overcome it and become more integrated and less bogus.

If you plant honesty, you will reap trust
If you plant goodness, you will reap friends
If you plant humility, you will reap greatness
If you plant perseverance, you will reap contentment
If you plant consideration, you will reap perspective
If you plant hard work, you will reap success
If you plant forgiveness, you will reap reconciliation
So, be careful what you plant now; it will determine what you will reap later.

Pope Francis has called for peace: "Terrorism and extremism do not help reach a solution to the conflict between Israelis and Palestinians, but fuel hatred, violence, revenge and only cause each other to suffer. The Middle East does not need war, but peace, a peace built on dialogue and the courage of fraternity... Please do not shed any more innocent blood, neither in the holy land, nor in Ukraine, nor anywhere else! Enough! Wars are

always a defeat, always!"

Feasts of the Week



Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

The feast of the Dedication of the Basilica of St John Lateran is celebrated by the entire Church. It marks the dedication of the cathedral church of Rome by Pope Sylvester I in 324. This church is

the cathedral (or chair) of the bishop of Rome, who is the Pope. A Latin inscription in the Church reads: "omnium ecclesiarum Urbis et Orbis mater et caput." Translated, that means, "The mother and head of all churches of the city and the world." The Basilica was originally named the Archbasilica of the Most Holy Saviour. However, it is called St John Lateran because it was built on property owned by the Church by the Laterani family, and because the monks from the monastery of St John the Baptist and St John the Divine served it.

Feast Day: November 9



St Leo the Great, also know as Pope Saint Leo I, was born into a Roman aristocratic family in Tuscany. He was Pope between 440 and 461 and he was the first Pope to be given the title "the Great". Pope Leo was responsible for important changes in the Church year. He added new feasts and placed greater importance on the celebration of Christmas.

He was well known for his great eloquence and writing skills. For his great gift of teaching, Pope Leo has been given the title of Doctor of the Church. Pope Leo was also a peacemaker. He personally convinced Attila the Hun to turn back at the gates of Rome from his planned invasion of the city. Leo is best known for being a good shepherd and paster for all the people of the Church, from bishops to the poor who begged for food on the streets of Rome. He reached out to the poor and neglected people of the world and urged the bishops to do the same. His homilies helped people know how to live their faith because they were full of practical advice. Leo died on November 10, 461. Feast Day: November 10



St Martin of Tours was born in Savaria, Pannonia in either the year 316 or 336 AD. At the age of ten he attended the Christian church against the wishes of his parents and became a catechumen. When Martin was fifteen he was required to join a calvary. About the age of 20, Martin made it clear to his superiors that we would no longer fight, following his formed

Christian conscience. In 371, the city of Tours needed a new bishop and the people decided to call Martin to the office. He was the third bishop of Tours. As a bishop Martin established a system of parishes to manage his diocese. Martin longed for more prayer and wanted to pursue a monastic life. In the year 372 Martin established an abbey at Marmoutier so he could retreat there and live as a monk with the many disciples he had attracted. The Monastery would be inhabited by the Benedictines. Martin died in Candes-Saint-Martin, Gaul in 397. He has become one of the most popular and recognizable Catholic Saints. Many miracles have been attributed to him. He even had a confrontation with Satan.


