Rejoice & share God's gifts

was going to die from rabies. The doctor told him to put his final affairs in order. So the man took pen and paper, and began writing furiously. In fact he wrote and wrote and wrote. Finally the doctor said, "That sure is a long will you're making." He snorted, "Will? No way! I'm making a list of all the people I'm going to bite!" The man is driven by his hatred to seek revenge.

In today's Gospel St. Mark tells "and the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts: and the angels waited on Him." Jesus went to the desert

before beginning his public life. This was not the only time Jesus sought the desert. From time to time we see him withdraw to find relief from crowds and to refresh His spirit in solitude. Jesus is driven by his love for the Father so he continues to seek God for comfort and strength.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, a day which we have the ritual of putting ashes on our



forehead, and fasting; accompanying with the words "Repent and be faithful to the Good News." Repent calls us to renew ourselves, renew our actions, words and be conscious of our sinfulness. Fasting is not simply to abstain from eating meat and consuming less food, but it reminds us of our need for God, the need to deepen our Spiritual life. While we are fasting, we also spend a few minutes a day to deepen our relationship with God and others. Furthermore, we are called to do some charitable work, helping those who are hungry, homeless, in the third world countries and to be aware of the needs of the people around us; our family members and our neighbours.

Let us take a moment during this Lent season to rejoice for all the gifts which God has given to us. May we be generous in sharing God's gifts with those who are in need of our support.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

538 The gospels speak of a time of solitude for Jesus in the desert immediately after his baptism by John. Driven by the Spirit into the desert, Jesus remained there for forty days without eating; he lives among wild beasts, and angels minister to him. At the end of this time Satan tempts him three times, seeking to compromise his filial attitude toward God. Jesus rebuffs these attacks, which recapitulate the temptations of Adam in Paradise and of Israel in the desert, and the devil leave him 'until an opportune time'.



FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The law of fasting binds those who have completed their 18th year, until the beginning

of their 60th year; the law of abstinence (from items made with meat - includes all the Fridays of Lent) binds those who have completed their 14th year (CCL 97, 1251-52).



L Turn away. The Season of Lent

Lent is the most appropriate time for celebrating the Sacrament of Penance. Already on Ash Wednesday the people of God have heard the solemn invitation. Turn away from sin and believe the Good News. It is therefore fitting to have

several penitential celebrations during Lent, so that all the faithful may have an opportunity to be reconciled with God and their neighbour and so be able to celebrate the paschal mystery in the Easter Triduum with renewed hearts. Second reading A reading from the first letter of St Peter

I Peter 3:18-22

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.
