A widow in her 80's thought about moving to a retirement village. Her youngest son who has no car, came to help her pack. The widow decided to give him her new car because she has no need for the car. When her other children heard this, they argued about how their mother would divide her assets. The widow heard about their concern, she gathered them together and told them that her things were hers to decide whom she wanted to give them to. What she did with her belongings had nothing to do with her love for each of them, and she felt disappointed about them arguing. She gave away her car because their brother needed it. She hoped they knew that she loved each of them equally. After they had left, the widow wondered what more she had to do to help her children know of her love for each of them.

The Gospel today raised the same question: what more God had to do to help us knowing of God's love for us. "A man can have no greater love than to lay

down his life for his friends. You are my friends. If you do what I command you." This is a challenged love. The great indicator of growth in our spiritual lives is when we move from the attitude of a servant to the free but, in its own way, more demanding attitude of a friend or relative. Servants work definite hours and walk out if they do not like what they are asked to do. But friendship will go beyond, especially in difficult times. Friendship entails mutual fidelity and loyalty. If we are friends of Jesus then we want to do his will. Love will not want to offend even in the least.

During the month of May we contemplate on Mary, our spiritual mother. She had entrusted


her life totally in God's hand and faithful to God's words. Let us learn from Mary, "I am the Lord's servant, let it be done to me according to your will." Despite all the sufferings and hardships, she never complained but tried to fulfil God's will. From the bottom of her heart she continues to praise God "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, and my spirit exults in God my saviour." Like Mary, may we always remain in God's love by keeping Jesus' commandments.

- ♦ Acolytes, Senior Altar Servers

If you volunteer in any of these ministries a WWCC needs to be submitted to the Parish Office before commencing in the role. WWCCs are renewed every 5 years and the updated WWCC also needs to be submitted to the Parish Office. Your date of birth and address is also required to allow the parish secretary to verify the WWCC with the Office of Child Protection.




A message from the Archdiocese of Sydney

St John de Avila

The Apostle of Andalusia and the spiritual advisor of St. Teresa, St. Francis Borgia, St. John of the Cross, St. Peter of Alcantara, and others. He was born on January 6, 1499, at Almodovar del Campo, Spain. After studying law at the University of Salamanca, he left the university to be a hermit. He

then went to Alcala, where he was ordained. John drew great crowds with his fiery denunciations of evil and his many sermons. A brief imprisonment by the Inquisition in Seville made him even more popular. His missionary efforts were centered on Andalusia, and his letters and other writings have become Spanish classics. John was canonized in 1970.

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said 'I am only a man after all!'

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.
